An artist Junichi Nakashima will deliver solo-performance on Himiko, a shaman queen of ancient Japan, followed by a talk on Japanese mythology and the notion of 言霊 (kotodama), the spirit of language.

Himiko (c. 170–248 AD) was a shaman queen of Yamataikoku in Wa (ancient Japan). Early Chinese dynastic histories chronicle tributary relations between Queen Himiko and the Cao Wei Kingdom (220–265), and record that the Yayoi period people chose her as ruler following decades of warfare among the kings of Wa. Early Japanese histories do not mention Himiko, but historians associate her with legendary figures such as Empress Consort Jingū, who was Regent (c. 200–269) in roughly the same era as Himiko. 
